THE PROSPECTOR - pilsner

A light and bright, crisp and refreshing finish unfiltered to ensure the fullest of flavour. IBU 17, ABV 4.5%

James Venture Mulligan was the first to find gold in the Palmer River. It was because of his thirst for adventure and tireless efforts that Port Douglas came to be. His story has inspired the refreshing brew you're holding.

HARD YARDS - dark lager

Crisp, light-bodied lager with colour malts. Malt dominates with chocolate, coffee & biscuit flavours.

IBU 11, ABV 4.7%

In 1877, when gold was found, The Bump Track was the only road to Port Douglas and it was no leisurely Sunday drive. Unforgiving and treacherous, it brought meaning to the term 'no pain, no gain'.

MRS WATSON'S - small ale (big flavour)

Low alcohol & full on flavour. An easy drinking ale features an orange colour, delivering tangerine and caramel taste characteristics. IBU 30, ABV 3.5%

In the late 1800's, the sea slug trade in Far North Queensland was a profitable and surprisingly perilous way to earn a living. But none felt this more than Captain Robert Watson's wife, baby daughter, and servant.

PITCHFORK BETTY'S - pale ale

Driven by malt with an all-Australian hoppy focus, balanced with passionfruit & pineapple tones. IBU 35, ABV 5.1%

She ruled a local watering hole not with an iron fist, but with her trusted and slightly rusted pitchfork. A staunch defender of the good times and good life in Port Douglas, she has inspired the beer you hold in your hand.

DOUG'S COURAGE - ipa

With a huge dry hopping regime that makes way for an aromatic overload of American based hops with citra and pine flavours, high alcohol style, it's certainly a beer for the bold. IBU 41, ABV 5.6%

March 16, 1911 - the day when Port Douglas was levelled by the mother of all cyclones. Battered but hardly beaten, a band of courageous locals rebuilt to continue the story of this place we love.

MR WONG - hefeweizen

A true Bavarian style hefeweizen. Cloudy and unfiltered, it presents pleasant banana aromas and is seriously refreshing. IBU 8, ABV 5.2%

Surprisingly to many, it was the Chinese who first introduced bananas into Australia. Chinese workers like Mr Wong, left the goldfields for another kind of gold, the banana. Fortunately for us, these versatile pioneers established plantations in the 1800's around Cooktown, Port Douglas, Cairns, Innisfail and Tully.
